No students will be allowed to leave campus for lunch. Students may bring their own lunch from school or order from our caterer.






SUPPLY LIST

OUR CURRICULUM

- Rigorous and relevant advanced curriculum.

- ABF Academy's program is aligned to the Florida B.E.S.T. Standards in ELA and Math and Next Generation Sunshine State Standards Curriculum encompasses the subject areas of Science and Social Studies.
- The school's curriculum promotes college readiness and will encourage your child to attain rigor in their curriculum.
- Middle school students are eligible to take high school credits.
- High school students are eligible to take Honors Courses and Dual Enrollment through MDC.



EDGENUITY

Student's must bring their own device EVERYDAY!

How It Works:

- Student's complete videos, activities, quizzes, and exams
- Assignments must be completed in order
- Teachers monitor progress and provide support
- Attendance and participation are tracked daily

Expectations:

- Students must meet weekly progress goals
- Plagiarism or skipping videos is not allowed
- Course completion is required for credit
- Daily logins and engagement are mandatory



EDGENUITY

Understanding Online Grades:



Actual Grade= The grade the student will receive each week for grade check. The actual grade is used for all quarter grade calculations and for the final grade if the student fully completes the course.

Overall Grade= The grade the student has earned on the work(assignments) he or she has completed thus far.

Relative Grade= The grade the student would receive in the course if he or she stopped working today.

The relative grade is used if the student does not complete 100% of the course.

Complete= How much of the course the student has completed to date.

Start Date = The date that the course is available to students to begin working.

Target Date = The date at which the course is expected to end.

Completion = How much of the course has been completed.

Target Completion = How close to the end date the student currently is.

Est. Time Remaining= How many hours are left in the course.

Daily Goal= How much time the student needs to spend working every day to meet their end date.



ACADEMIC & DIGITAL INTEGRITY

- Integrity and authenticity of student work is a MUST!
- Students must abide by copyright laws. Proper usage of school internet.
- Inappropriate use of digital devices and school internet will be monitored.
- Parent Monitoring of digital devices (Social Media Accounts and Postings)
- Parent Acknowledgement Form must be signed and returned.

CELLPHONE POLICY

Cell Phones and other electronic signaling devices may not be activated inside any classroom or building. Students are permitted to use cell phones during non-instructional minutes consisting of lunch time, passing periods, and before or after school.

Warning- phone must be put away and remain out of sight

1st Offense- Detention, phone is confiscated by teacher and returned to student at the end of the day.



2nd Offense- Detention, phone is confiscated and returned to the parent only.

ATTENDANCE POLICY

Florida law defines "habitual truant" as a student who has 10 or more unexcused absences within an academic year with or without the knowledge or consent of the student's parent or guardian, and who is subject to compulsory school attendance.

Florida law (Section 1003.436, Florida Statute) defines a full credit as a minimum 135 hours of bona fide instruction in a designated course of study.

PARENT RESPONSIBILITY Florida Statutes, 1003.24 defines the responsibility of parents for the attendance of their child at school and requires them to provide an explanation for any absence from school.

WHY ATTENDANCE IS IMPORTANT:

- Everyday counts! Learning builds daily
- Frequent absences affect academic progress
- Being on time sets students up for success



ATTENDANCE POLICY

- Students are expected to attend every day and arrive on time
- 3 tardies = 1 unexcused absence
- Absences must be reported to the front office
- Provide a written note or doctor's note for excused absences

CHRONIC ABSENTEEISM:

- Missing 10% or more of the school year (even if excused) is considered chronic
- We will work with families to support better attendance



ATHLETIC ATTENDANCE POLICY

Students are expected to be on time and attend both morning and afternoon practices as scheduled by coaches.

Per Quarter (9 Weeks):

0-4 absences = A (Full participation)

5 absences = B

10 absences = C

15 absences = D (Not eligible for games)

16+ absences = F (Not eligible for games)


3 tardies = 1 absence
